Senior citizens and smaller solid waste containers

The City received the smaller trash and recycling containers on August 14th. Those senior citizens who have requested but not yet received their small containers do not have to contact Public Works.

Public Works will deliver the smaller containers and collect the larger containers beginning the week of August 28th which is a trash and recycling collection week. Public Works crews will deliver the containers the day after your scheduled service day to ensure the containers are emptied and ready for pickup. If your service is Monday, the container exchange will occur on Tuesday. For those residents on Monday through Thursday collection routes, please leave your cans at the "curb" the day after your scheduled collection day. For residents on Friday's collection route, the containers will be replaced on Tuesday, September 5th. If you are on Friday's route, please ensure your containers are emptied and at the "curb" on September 5th.

New Memory Cart in the Local History Room

The Library's Memory Cart is located in the Local History Room and is available for use on a first come, first serve basis.

Plan ahead!

Important information to know before using the Memory Cart:

- All users of the Local History Room are required to sign in and provide a license or other form of identification to be left at the circulation desk while using the room.
- The Memory Cart may not be used to digitize materials that are currently under copyright. § 201.14 Warnings of copyright for use by certain libraries and archives.
- VHS footage is digitized in real time. If your VHS tape is 1 hour long, it will take 1 hour to digitize it.
- Patrons using the Memory Cart should stay with their materials while they are being digitized. Plan ahead, bring a book or another project that can be worked on while you wait.

The Laptop on the Memory Cart is not connected to the internet. You will need to bring the following to save your files to bring home:

- USB Flash Drive or USB external storage device for photographs and digitized VHS
- SD/SDHC card no larger than 32GB to save 8mm/Super8 film

What can be digitized using the Library's Memory Cart?

The Laconia Public Library's Memory Cart is equipped with:

- Laptop
- VHS Vidbox Converter and VCR so you can digitize your home movies
- Epson flatbed photo scanner for your photographs, mounted slides, 35mm negatives, and medium format negatives.
- Wolverine 8mm/Super 8 digitizer that saves footage from 8mm film/Super 8 reels

The cart is equipped with easy-to-follow instructions for each device and staff may be available to assist as needed.

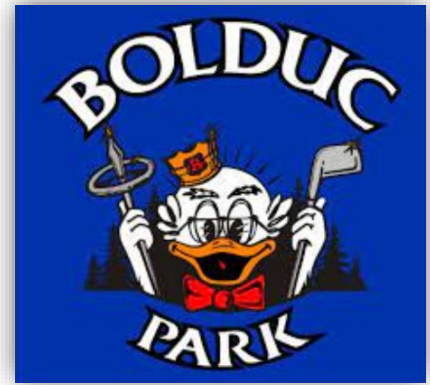

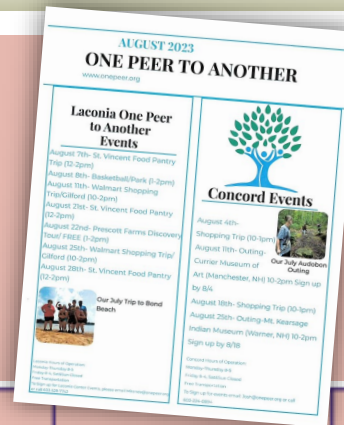

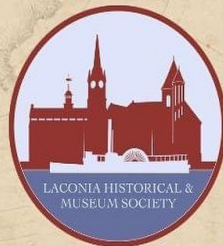

THEN ...

After completion of the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s and early 1970s, this is what 'Bank Square,' Laconia, looked like. Lynch's, a women's clothing store, opened Oct. 7, 1970, in the building at left. Vehicular traffic ended, Nov. 3, 1970, and the planters and raised platform for musical and other events were completed in 1971. Benjamin's opened, in the former Woolworth Building, April 15, 1971. ... AND NOW

The pedestrian mall was discontinued and Main Street was reopened, July 8, 1994, to vehicular traffic and limited parking. Current occupants of building at left include Rent-A-Center and MC Cycle. Town and Campus Shop succeeded Benjamin's in 1971, followed by the Sundial Shop in 1973. After Sundial closed in 2010, the building was redeveloped and the exterior remodeled during the summer of 2011. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)

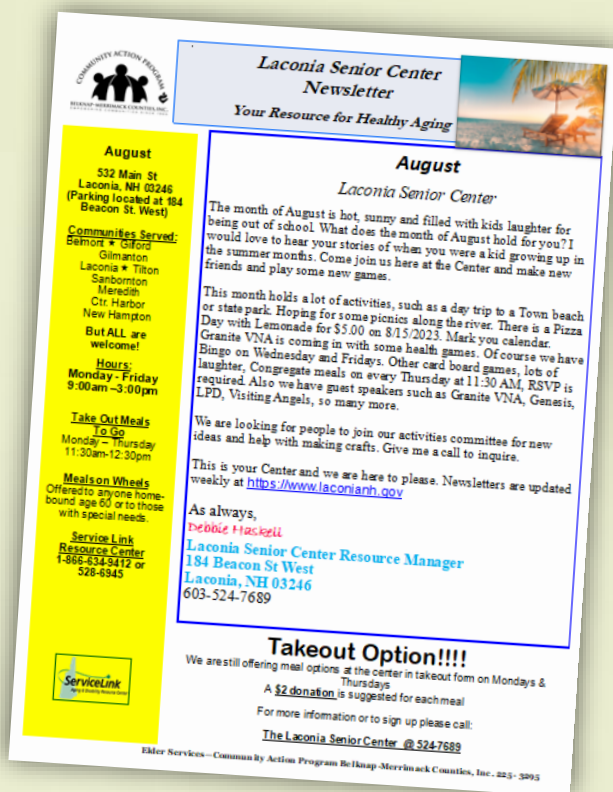

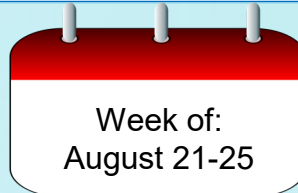
