

Howard Ballou's restaurant, cabins and bowling, at Weirs Beach, are seen from Lakeside Avenue in the late 1940s. Ballou sold the restaurant and bowling alleys to Sidney E. Ames in 1950 and the cabins and Korner Kubbard store, in 1956. The Lake View House remains a landmark on Tower Hill. Weirs United Methodist Church — formerly Trinity Methodist Church, at right — was built in 1926 to replace a former structure that burned in 1924, along with the old hotel and other structures.
