## Laconia Historical & Museum Society – *Our Local Veterans: The Revolutionary War to the Persian Gulf*

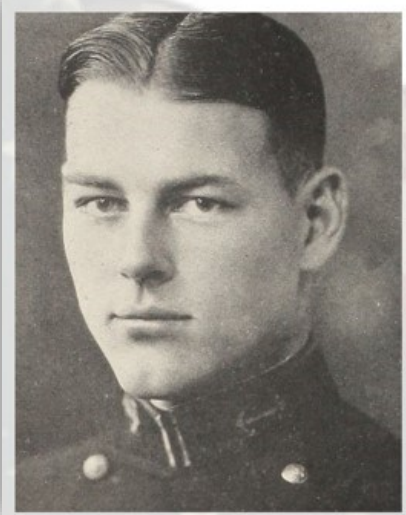
A slideshow presentation of *Our Local Veterans: The Revolutionary War to the Persian Gulf* will be shared on Wednesday, November 15th at 6:00pm in the Laconia Rotary Auditorium at the Laconia Public Library. As part of the Laconia Historical & Museum Society's 'Our Yesterday's 2023 Presentation Series', this is a free program that the community is welcome and encouraged to attend.

The possibility of one of Laconia's own being present during Benedict Arnold's treasonous attempt to turn-over West Point in 1780, the incredible bravery of a Lieutenant Commander refusing to give up his post during one of the worst battles of WW2, and what a local doctor saw on the front lines that made him apologize to his wife for his vehemence are only a few of the stories that will be part of the *Our Local Veterans* presentation.

Raymond Peavy, Jr., LHMS Board member and retired Senior Chief Petty Officer, will share excerpts and stories about Laconia veterans who served in our nation's military from the Revolutionary War onward. Ray served a combined total of 26 years with the US Marine Corps and Navy Seabees. He works tirelessly to preserve and share the history of our community's veterans.

An exhibit of the same name, consisting of military items and remembrances, is available for viewing at scheduled times until Saturday, December 9<sup>th</sup> at the historic Lakeport Freight House Museum in Lakeport Square.

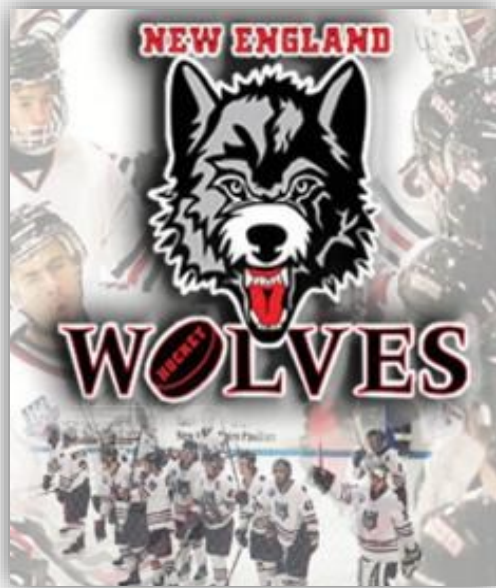

**In addition to the weeks of Fall Leaf Collection did you know that Laconia residents can also bring their leaves to the Transfer Station and dispose of them at no charge?**

**There is no dump sticker or day pass required, just be sure to bring proof of residency with you showing you are a Laconia resident.**

**If your leaves are in a paper compost bag there is no need to empty them; if your leaves are in a plastic bag, you will have to empty the leaves out of the bag into the compost pile.**

# City Curbside Solid Waste Collection during the winter for residents and businesses with curbside collection

## ***Where and how to place your solid waste containers during the winter to ensure the containers can be emptied***

Treat your solid waste containers as a mailbox! What happens If you do not dig out your mailbox after a snowstorm? The Post Office does not deliver mail!

For solid waste collection if you put your solid waste containers behind snowbanks, they cannot be emptied.

### For rural area residences and businesses without sidewalks -

Place your containers in your driveway near the edge of the road, or dig out an area in the snowbank to create an opening in which to place your containers. Make sure the opening is 2 feet wider on each side than the containers. The depth of the opening only has to be deep enough to provide 1 foot of clearance from the back of the container.

### For residents and businesses in areas of the City with sidewalks -

Place your containers in your driveway near the edge of the road.

If you do not have a driveway or the driveway is too small and:

Where the sidewalk is against the curb at the edge of the road, dig an opening through the snow bank out to the street in which to place your containers.

Make sure the opening is 2 feet wider on each side than the containers.

If there is a grass or gravel area between the sidewalk and the edge of the road:

Place the containers in your driveway near the edge of the road, or dig out an area in the snowbank to place your containers.

Make sure the opening is 2 feet wider on each side than the containers. The depth of the opening only has to be deep enough to provide 1 foot of clearance from the back of the container.

Please do not place your containers out for collection before 7 pm the night before your scheduled collection day, and bring them back to the residence or business at the end of the collection day. Do not leave your containers on the sidewalk so that pedestrians can use the sidewalk. If collection is canceled due to a major snowstorm, please bring the containers back onto your property so that the City's plow crews can keep the streets and sidewalks open for your use.

Will the contractor collect containers during a snowstorm? The contractor will provide curbside solid waste collection service during a minor to moderate snowstorm.

The contractor and Public Works consider canceling collection services when forecasters are predicting blizzard or near blizzard conditions. If the contractor decides to cancel collection due to the forecast, the City will post the cancellation notice on the City's [website](#) in the banner section on the top of the City's home page. For those residents who have signed up to receive City alerts, you will receive an e-mail informing you that solid waste will not be collected and the collection schedule for the remainder of the week. If you are not yet signed up to receive alerts and wish to do so, please sign up [here](#).

### Solid waste collection and snow plowing –

Public Works leaders and crews will adjust their plowing procedures during minor to moderate storms to minimize the impact of plowing on scheduled curbside collection. Please help the City by following the recommendations in this notice. Call Public Works at 603-528-6379 with questions or for more details.

# WINTER PARKING BAN

Winter parking ban began Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>



As of November 1st, vehicles and trailers cannot be parked on a public street from midnight to 6:30 am. This ban allows Public Works crews to plow snow piles back against the curb and clear snow from the streets when there is little traffic on the street. Vehicles parked on a public street during this time may be ticketed or towed at the discretion of the Chief of Police or the Public Works Director. The fine for parking on a public street during these hours is \$25.00.

## Hilliard Road Brush Dump

From November 1st to March 31st, the City of Laconia Hilliard Rd. Brush Dump, located at 325 Hilliard Road will be open for winter hours! It will be open every Friday and Saturday from 10 am to 2 pm, unless it is snowing. If there is a snowstorm, this facility will be closed as all Public Works personnel are involved with snow removal. Residents using this facility must have a Laconia dump sticker or a day pass.

We accept clean wood only (not painted, stained or pressure treated). Wood and tree branches must be no longer than 3 feet with a diameter of 3 inches or less. Leaves are not accepted at the Brush Dump.

## 2023 Assessed Values Now available

This assessment is based on fair market value using market data from April 1, 2022, through March 31, 2023. This allows municipalities to assess properties accurately, fairly, and at true value.



Please do not use the current tax rate to calculate your taxes. Doing so will result in an inaccurate tax liability. The Department of Revenue Administration will adjust the tax rate prior to billing.

## THEN ...

**Beauchaine & Sons Inc. operated a machine shop to the rear of this location — 580 Union Ave. — for a number of years in the late 1940s and 1950s, erecting this new building in 1960. In 1953, the Esty Sprinkler Co. had moved from Mill Street to 584 Union Ave., to share space with Beauchaine in a recently enlarged building, representing the fourth expansion to the shop, which had been completed in 1952. **Beauchaine moved to 117 Union Ave. (the former W.D. Huse & Sons Machine Shop and Laconia Needle Co. Building) in 1964 and the C.C. 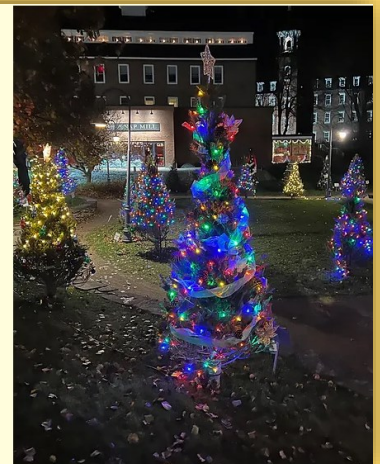
