IT'S POTHOLE SEASON!



Drive carefully!

**Winter is ending and
Spring is upon us!
The City's roads are
experiencing the annual
transition when gravel
roads become soft,
potholes are plentiful and
the roads heave due to the
freeze thaw cycle.**

The groundwater table is high. This causes water to seep out of the ground on hillsides making gravel road surfaces muddy.

Dirt roads that were solid when you left in the morning will be soft and slippery when you return. Drive carefully! Dirt roads will rut, and the roads will become muddier as the dirt absorbs more water from rain and runoff. Keeping your wheels out of ruts will help ensure your safety. Public Works monitors dirt roads and adds gravel to the worst spots to ensure the roads remain passable.

The freeze thaw cycle during this time of year generates potholes daily. Most potholes are located on old roads that have cracks or joints in them from road or utility work. If you are on a road with these conditions and you see standing water, it is likely that there is a pothole in the water. If it is safe to do so, adjust your position in the lane to avoid the pothole. Public Works has crews out daily filling potholes, but during this period they can appear faster than we can fill them.

Heaves are caused when the water content in soil under the road increases and the soil expands as it is frozen, lifting the road surface. You will also find this condition on older roads that have cracks in the road. When driving on these roads slow down and exercise caution. Public Works posts frost heave signs on roads when the crews find them or when they are reported. There may be areas and times when roads or sections of roads do not have signs posted. As the ground thaws, these heaves will settle.

As we move from winter further into spring the challenges associated with muddy roads, potholes and frost heaves will lessen. Please call Public Works at 603-528-6379 with questions or concerns.

The Church Street bridge repair project starts March 11th.

The Church Street bridge was built in 1980 and is over 43 years old. The bridge needs some work to recondition it for the next 20 years of its life.

The project will repair the bridge's expansion joint that is on its east side and the area where the sidewalk and road surface meets. The work includes:

- Replacement of the expansion joint. Over the years the joint has corroded, and it is no longer capable of retaining the gasket that prevents stormwater and salt from getting onto the metal bearings. These bearings allow the bridge to expand and contract.

- Removal of the granite curb on the downstream side of the bridge and repairs to the sidewalk. The joint between the granite curb and the deck allows saltwater to get into the deck, corroding the steel, and weakening the concrete. The contractor will remove 3 feet of sidewalk measured from the curb for the full length of the bridge. This is to enable the contractor to repair the deck and the sidewalk.

On Monday March 11th the contractor will block the parking spaces on the downstream side of the bridge to remove the curbing and to remove the sidewalk. Both travel lanes will be open this week.

On March 18th, the contractor will block the downstream side of the bridge to begin the process of removing and repairing the deck and the joint. Traffic will be two way alternating and the contractor will be using the temporary traffic signals with the countdown timers similar to the ones used on the Messer Street bridge last year. The sidewalk on the upstream side of the bridge will remain open during the work.






... AND NOW

Since 1989, Concord Area Transit (CAT) has served Concord area residents and visitors as the public transportation service with regular fixed-route bus service and specialized services for seniors and ADA complementary paratransit service. It provides bus service throughout Concord and surrounding points, including Penacook, Concord Hospital, Downtown, Memorial Field, Fort Eddy Road Plaza, NHTI and Concord Heights. Buses operate Monday through Friday, 6am-6:30pm. No ticket or cash is needed as all services are fare-free. The Concord-Laconia Connector connects the Lakes Region to southern NH CAT Launches New Commuter Bus Route – the Concord-Laconia Connector

Have you heard? Concord Area Transit started running the Concord-Laconia Connector intercity commuter bus route last month. This service is offered fare-free connecting Concord to Franklin, Tilton, and Laconia.

The Concord-Laconia Connector (CLC) has 15 bus stops along the route, including major employment, medical and retail destinations such as Merchant's Way, Merrimack County Complex (Nursing Home and County Corrections), Franklin Industrial Park, J. Jill Distribution Center, Tanger Outlet, Belknap Mall, Concord Hospital-Laconia, and downtown Laconia.

The bus makes four round trips per day with the first leaving downtown Concord at 5:45 AM arriving at Concord Hospital-Laconia at 7:26 AM and the Church St parking lot downtown Laconia at 7:31am.

Terri Paige, Transportation Director for Community Action Program Belknap-Merrimack which operates CAT, says "We are very excited about this new route. It gives residents of these communities access to thousands of jobs, while also providing a way for residents to travel to medical appointments and other services outside their home community. And since it is fare free, it will give them a much-needed break from the cost of driving".

Those using the CLC connects to the existing CAT routes via the Penacook Route in Penacook. The routes are timed for a quick, easy transfer at the Penacook Family Physicians bus stop.




