## Property Taxes - Deductions and Exemptions



Do you own your home in Laconia and is it your primary residence? Are you a veteran who served our country and were honorably discharged? If so, you may qualify for a veteran credit. If you are 65 years or older and meet the necessary income and asset limits you may qualify for an elderly exemption.



## THEN ...

Downtown Laconia is seen in the early 1960s from the Quik Laundry driveway, off South Main Street (off-photo at left). In the distance, Laflamme's Bakery and the Tilton Block dominate the landscape, with 'Baldi's Corner' (Laconia Fruit Co.) across the street. Further to the right is the King (later Turcotte) Block and, at right, the former Woodbury Melcher House, which had originally been located at the Union Avenue-South Main Street corner, approximately where the Whittum service station is seen here, just left of center. The house at extreme right is on Baldwin Street. Dorval & Malone Texaco station is at extreme left. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)




## ... AND NOW

Sunrise Towers (extreme right) opened in 1970 and Sunrise House (center left) was converted in 2019 from the former Melcher & Prescott office building (opened in 1969), which replaced the Whittum service station. Water Works has contracted with Busby Construction to install a water main from their pump station on Weirs Boulevard that is south of the Ice cream shop to just north of the ice cream shop.

This pipe will connect to another circuit in their system to provide an alternate route in case of future water main breaks in the northern part of Weirs Boulevard.

Similar to the work that Busby Construction did last year on Weirs Boulevard, northbound traffic during the day will be detoured up White Oaks Road while southbound traffic will continue to use Weirs Boulevard. At night, Weirs Boulevard will be open for two-way traffic.

This duration of the project is three weeks, and the daytime detour will be in place for the duration of the project. As always, we appreciate the public's cooperation and patience. Questions? Please call the Public Works Department at 603-528-6379.





Per RSA 466:1 all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the license number issued imprinted, as well as a paper license. The tag issued must be worn on the dog's collar at all times. Please remember that a valid rabies certificate and proof of inoculation (if applicable) are required to register. All dogs need to be registered by April 30 of each year.



We are happy to help register your dog in person here in City Hall or you can use our on-line registration. Just click the image (left). When processing your registration online, please be sure to add the two or three digit prefix (22- or VET-.)

*For the comfort and safety of all, we ask that you leave your dog at home when you come into City Hall to conduct business. Although we love seeing your four-legged family members, we would like to encourage you to be conscious of others. As always, certified service animals are welcome.*




