The parade route will begin at the Laconia High School to Church Street and end at Opechee Park.





FOR RELEASE - May 31, 2024

As we celebrate the 100th year of Laconia High School on the Union Avenue campus, we are excited about the ongoing construction upgrades to our facility. Here is a brief history of what we have done on two projects and an update of where these projects are at.

Laconia High School Construction Project

In June of 2022, the Laconia School Board approved the use of \$6.7 million in Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds that the District had received for Covid relief to add ventilation to the 1923 building, individualize the bathrooms, and to renovate the kitchen (where food is served to students in the cafeteria). These projects began at the beginning of this school year and are being completed this summer.

On Wednesday, June 12 from 2:30 to 4:00, the temporary partition wall will come down and we will open the kitchen for the public to see. The District will be sending out more information on this event.

Below are some pictures to show the progress of the work we have done at this point.

Ventilation

The ventilation duct work is covered by drywall in the far back corner of the room. The rooftop units are scheduled to be installed in early June.



Kitchen

To the right is the serving area which will be more open and designed for better workflow for the kitchen staff.



The windows with the red frames will allow for students and staff to see into the serving area and into the cafeteria from the other side (see photo on the right). There will be two openings for students to check out on both sides of the glass. These openings will have pull-down doors that will be used when the kitchen is closed.



To the left is a view into the kitchen manager's office. The windows will give her a view into the serving area.

Bathrooms

The single bathrooms on the ground floor have been tiled with drains. As you can see here, the sinks and toilets have been installed. There are six (6) single-stall bathrooms on the ground floor. Work on the second and third floor bathrooms is scheduled for this summer and they should be open for the 2024-25 school year.



LHS Phase 2 Construction Project

This month the Laconia School Board, and our City Council, approved the use of reserve funds to be used to expand ventilation work into the Math Wing of the 1936 building and to upgrade the locker rooms. Laconia High School (LHS) has state-of-the art athletic facilities, with a gym that has new stadium seats and a refinished floor, and the Jim Fitzgerald Athletic Field in the Bank of New Hampshire Stadium that opened in 2013. The renovation of the locker rooms will be a great step to making the athletic facilities on the campus truly state of the art.

This work is a part of our continued effort to maintain and upgrade our facilities at LHS and the School District. Construction projects like these impact school operations. Our staff, students and families at LHS have done an amazing job of being flexible to keep the building running knowing that the final product is going to be a great improvement to the campus! We are grateful for the work and expertise of **Rist-Frost-Shumway and Harvey Construction** for their work on these projects and many others they have done for the school district over the past few decades.

On behalf of the Laconia School District, we hope you had a wonderful Memorial Day weekend. We are grateful for the people who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our great nation.




Our yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN ...

A landmark at 'McIntyre Circle' for three decades — from the 1970s to 1999 — the Big Banana purveyed fruits, vegetables, bakery and delicatessen products, meats and fish. However, the structure had been built in 1948 by McIntyre Properties as 'a white Colonial ice cream bar and restaurant,' known as Foster's Ice Cream Barn, Foster's Restaurant and the Red Barn Restaurant, with a portion occupied by the Boot Barn. ... AND NOW

The Big Banana had begun as a seasonal business around 1972. Joseph Rotonnelli and Howard Goodman took over from 1977 until 1991, when it closed. Toward the end of the 1990s, the Roadkill Cafe occupied the building and, 25 years ago this week, in 1999, it and several other buildings were demolished to make way for a new Shaw's supermarket complex (glimpsed in the background), along with a remodeled Mobil filling station, to the right (east). In conjunction with the new buildings, the intersection known colloquially as 'McIntyre Circle' was redesigned as a 'Tee.' (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)







Although the target population is those families who qualify for "free and reduced" lunches at the school, it is not a requirement for participation. This community-wide effort is for all students registered in the Laconia School District whether public, private or home schooled. If you need help feeding your children/child this summer, this program is designed for you. GOT LUNCH! Laconia does not want any child to go hungry.

New registration is required each year even if you participated previously. Paper forms will not be used; please register online at gotlunchlaconia.com. June 17th is the deadline to receive the first delivery on June 24. You may continue to register at any time throughout the summer, but new registrations close one week before each delivery date to enable drop-off routes to be developed. Delivery will continue for ten weeks throughout the summer, ending Monday, August 26.

Last summer, 2023, more than 500 children and 300 families benefited from the 10 week program of fresh vegetables, healthy food and literacy materials for the students. Got Lunch!
