In case of rain, there are no refunds for pre-registration as this is a fundraiser for the Rotary Club. Thank you to our sponsors for helping to make this year's show a success!







GOT LUNCH! LACONIA

GOT LUNCH! Laconia is beginning its 14th season! This summer lunch program delivers healthy food directly

to the child's home each week. Although the target population is those families who qualify for "free and reduced" lunches at the school, it is not a requirement for participation. This community-wide effort is for all students registered in the Laconia School District whether public, private or home schooled. If you need help feeding your children/child this summer, this program is designed for you. GOT LUNCH! Laconia does not want any child to go hungry.

New registration is required each year even if you participated previously. Paper forms will not be used; please register online at gotlunchlaconia.com. June 17th is the deadline to receive the first delivery on June 24. You may continue to register at any time throughout the summer, but new registrations close one week before each delivery date to enable drop-off routes to be developed. Delivery will continue for ten weeks throughout the summer, ending Monday, August 26.

Last summer, 2023, more than 500 children and 300 families benefited from the 10 week program of fresh vegetables, healthy food and literacy materials for the students. Got Lunch! Laconia is grateful for over 100 volunteers who make this program successful. Happy to add that no more volunteers are needed at this time. THEN ...

The imposing Mount Belknap Hotel, in Lakeport Square, is seen in this vintage postcard. Part of the Opera House is glimpsed at left, with the adjoining Osgood Block (long home to Simpson's Market) and then the Cushing Block (home to Muzsey & Hopkins, later Hopkins & Barlow hardware stores). Mount Belknap Garage is seen at rear. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Osgood Block burned in 1939 and was replaced by a First National Stores grocery, later occupied by Henry Rogers' Five Cents to a Dollar Store and more recently by the Chaos and Kindness Store. The hotel and Cushing Block were razed in 1975 and the Lake Village Apartments opened in 1983. The Moulton-Adams House, at right, was built around 1830. Horace Adams went to California soon after the discovery of gold and became a prominent citizen of San Francisco (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)

Medicare Rights | State Health Insurance Assistance Program | Senior Medicare Patrol

New to Medicare

Medicare is the federal government program that provides health care coverage, or health insurance. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is the federal agency that runs Medicare. The program is funded in part by Social Security and Medicare taxes that you pay on your income, in part through premiums that people with Medicare pay to help run the program budget. Some people are eligible for Medicare due to their age, while others are eligible due to having a disability or chronic condition. If you are new to Medicare, there can be a lot to learn around your enrollment and coverage choices.

Medicare Part A (inpatient coverage) and Part B (outpatient coverage)

Some people are automatically enrolled in Medicare. For example, if you are already receiving retirement benefits from Social Security when you become Medicare-eligible, or if you've been collecting Social Security Disability Insurance for two years. If you are automatically enrolled, you should receive a package in the mail with your Medicare insurance card telling you so. Otherwise, there are three times to enroll in Parts A and B:

IEP

Initial Enrollment Period (IEP): The three months before, the month of, and the three months after your 65th birthday.

SEP

Special Enrollment Period (SEP): Allows you to delay Medicare enrollment without owing a late enrollment penalty. You may qualify for an SEP if:
• You or your spouse (or sometimes another family member) are still working, and you are covered by group health insurance. Note that you shouldn't delay Medicare enrollment if this employer coverage pays secondary to Medicare.
• You have experienced other exceptional circumstances, like losing Medicaid coverage, being released from incarceration, being misinformed by an employer, or being impacted by an emergency or disaster.

GEP

General Enrollment Period (GEP): Every year from January 1 through March 31. You may owe a late enrollment penalty and face gaps in coverage if you use the GEP.

Note: Most people qualify for premium-free Part A because of their or their spouse's work history. If you qualify for premium-free Part A, you can enroll in it at any time once eligible. In other words, you don't have to wait for an enrollment period. In contrast, you must use an enrollment period to enroll in Part B or premium Part A.

Hannaford Supermarkets Continues Tradition as Presenting Sponsor for the 2024 Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction



BULK RECYCLING



City Council establishes a fee for bulk recycling brought by businesses and other commercial operations to the Laconia Transfer Station

The cost of recycling has increased significantly over the last several years. How much it costs to recycle is based on the commodity market. Typically, the value of the commodity is not enough to cover the cost of sorting and processing single stream recycling. Over the last year the cost of recycling has varied between \$93 and \$160 ton.

To minimize the impact of the solid waste program on taxpayers, the City approved a fee for charging businesses, and other commercial entities, who bring their recycling to the City's Transfer Station for recycling.

Businesses and commercial entities that bring recycling to the Transfer Station that is more than can fit in the back of a 5-foot bed of a pickup truck will be paying the commercial bulk recycling fee.

Residents who bring a lesser amount to the Transfer Station can still recycle for free.

The Transfer Station will start charging the fee on July 1, 2024. The fee will be updated every six months based on the value of the commodities for the previous six months.

Let's make this a great parade!


The parade route will begin at the Laconia High School to Church Street and end at Opechee Park.
