VOTER INFORMATION

For the Primary Election:

Voters who are Undeclared (aka Independent) may participate in this election. When checking in at the polling location, these voters can choose to take either a Democrat or Republican ballot. When exiting the polls, it is advised to check with the election workers before leaving the polls to change back to Undeclared if you want to avoid having your party affiliation changed to Democrat or Republican. Any voters who are already declared as a Democrat or Republican will automatically be provided with that party's ballot when checking in at their polling place.

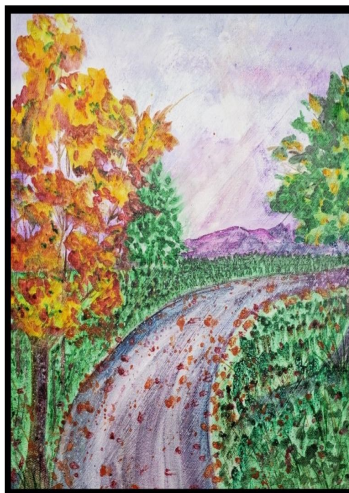

THEN ...

The first Laconia passenger station, erected in 1848 when tracks of the Boston, Concord & Montreal Railroad reached Meredith Bridge, stood just south of the Pleasant Street crossing (just off-photo in lower left corner). It remained there until 1892, when a new granite station was built, up the tracks (off-photo at left) at the same time that Depot (now Veterans) Square was created. At that time, the old passenger station was sold and moved down and across the tracks — where it served as home to a number of businesses, among them J.J. Morin and, currently, the Salvation Army Thrift Store. A new brick Freight Depot occupied the old Passenger Station site from 1892 until July 1970, when that structure was demolished to make way for the new Beacon Street West. (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

Site of the old Passenger Station (and successor Freight Depot) is now the entrance to Beacon Street West, which appears in front — and just off-photo at right — of the new Bank of New, Hampshire offices, now nearing completion. 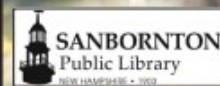

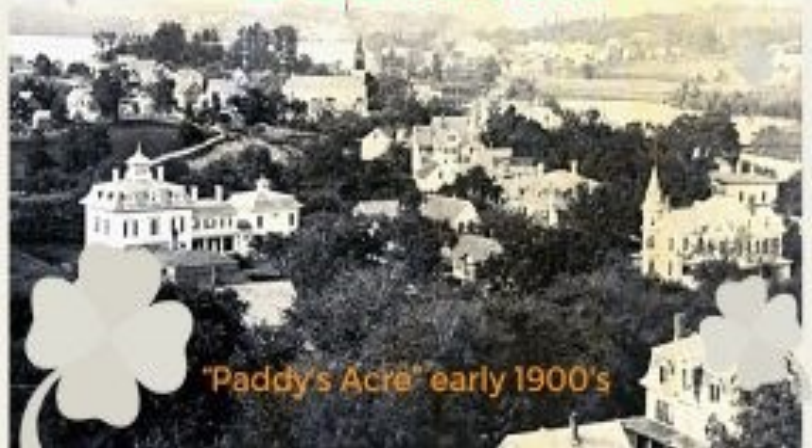

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS Seminar

PURPOSE

- To increase the participant's knowledge about Emergency Preparedness.
- To provide participants with insight into Emergency Operations Planning.

TOPICS

Emergency Preparedness and Whole Community Approach

Faith Based Community Organizations (FBCOs) can be a safe, inviting place for people to attend, worship, and fulfill meaningful parts of their and the community's lives. With a FBCO, there can be dangers to both mitigate and respond to, like any other place where people assemble in the community. FBCOs can also be a tremendous resource for communities when properly included in local emergency preparedness plans.

Emergency and Safety Planning Fundamentals

This session presents the basics of creating an Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) wherein, with training and practice, FBCOs can create safe places to gather and ensure effective response procedures and resources during times of emergencies and/or disaster.

Active Threat Preparation and Response

FBCOs are considered "soft targets" in today's sometimes violent world. Preparing for and responding to active threats (hate crimes, weapons, disruptive people) involves teaching, planning, and exercising. This session will help participants maintain and use situational awareness and effective response to their fullest, helping to potentially save lives and reduce injury.
