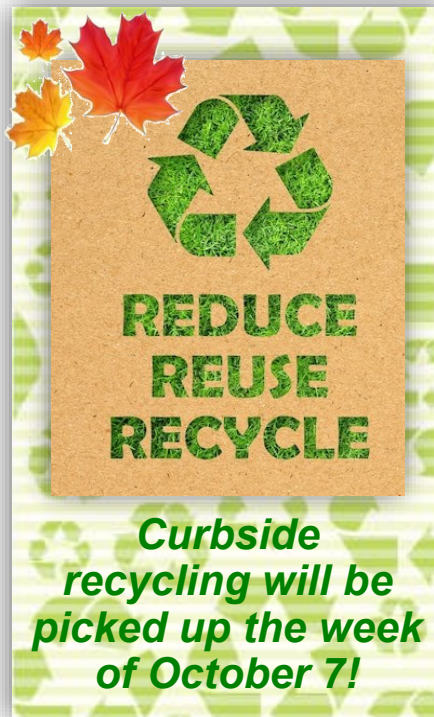

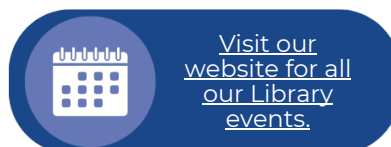
Please note that the leaf collection will be done by a separate truck, not the normal trash collection truck.

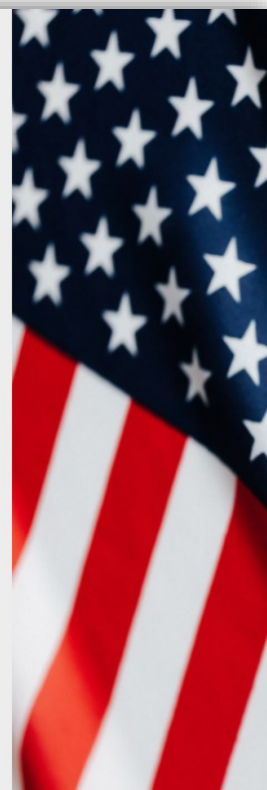

Volunteering for a trash cleanup event is a rewarding and fun experience for all ages, but there are some safety rules and guidelines that everyone should follow to make this event safe and enjoyable for everyone involved. - Bring a phone or camera to document what you clean up!

Belknap Mill Quilters Guild

The Belknap Quilter's Guild will present a lecture by Betsy Habich "Thread Painting, It's All About the Details", October 9 at 7 pm at the Belknap Mill



Betsy's work has been awarded at regional quilt shows including the Vermont Quilt Festival, The Gathering, and Machine Quilters Expo (MQX), and juried into national and regional shows, including International Quilt Association (IQA/Houston), American Quilters Society (AQS/Paducah). She has taught at Fiber College of Maine, Connections Quilt Festival, and at guilds, and has had several solo shows at local shows, shops, and libraries. She lives with her husband, three cats, and a happy studio full of fabric and thread in Beverly Farms, MA.

Thread Painting: It's All About the Details!

Slide & trunk show talk. A short introduction to pieced and appliqued pictorial quilts shows the quilting style Betsy developed to support the images, a bridge to thread painting. Then you see how to make a photorealistic thread painting: selecting the right photo, printing it on fabric, seeing all the colors in the piece, selecting threads, different stitches, blending colors smoothly, representing texture, and paying attention to detail. The third part follows a landscape thread-painting from start to finish, to show how a painting actually develops. Q&A and opportunity to look at the quilts follow. 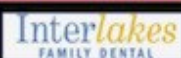

***Do you need additional containers for your trash and recycling?
Do you live in a single-family home or a duplex or triplex?***

Then you are eligible to participate in the City's additional container program!

This program enables eligible properties to obtain additional collection service at the curb for a fee. The fee is an annual fee and is paid at the beginning of the year. The program starts this October, and the first year's fee will cover service from October 2024 to December 31, 2025. The fee consists of three elements:

- A onetime fee for obtaining the containers. (The containers remain City property).
- An annual fee for enrolling in the program which is presently \$100.
- A fee for collection and disposal of your solid waste.

Eligible households can obtain a set consisting of a 65-gallon trash container and a 95-gallon recycling container or they can obtain just one of the containers. The fees for this service are:

THEN ...

Site of the Avery Dam reconstruction, in Laconia, from late September to Dec. 9, 1949, shows the old wooden Mill Street Bridge, by that time closed to all but pedestrian traffic. A temporary flume provides water to Pitman Hosiery Co., glimpsed at lower right corner, while the new concrete dam is being built, just up river from the bridge. The so-called Esty Mill is seen in lower left corner and the brick office building of Sterling Engineering is just above the bridge at right, with the 'Old Red Mill' behind it. ... AND NOW

It's now been 75 years since the Avery Dam was being rebuilt. The Mill Street Bridge was replaced by a steel footbridge, which opened Nov. 13, 1958. The Esty Mill was demolished in 1970, during the city's Urban Renewal Program, as was the brick office building on the south bank of the river. A hydro-electric generating plant (at right) went on line in 1985-1986 at the dam. The Old Red Mill was razed to make way for River's Edge (seen in distance), which opened, Aug. 19, 2016. 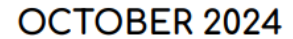
