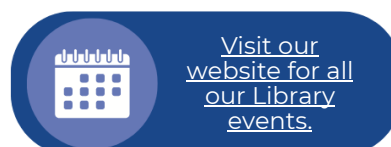

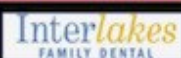

THEN ...

Bank Square, Laconia, is seen in the early 1970s after completion of the downtown pedestrian mall. Lynch's, at left, had its grand opening, Oct. 7, 1970 and Benjamin's Clothing Inc. opened, April 15, 1971, in the former F.W. Woolworth Building. Top of the McIntyre Block is glimpsed at left, above Lynch's. Melnick's Shoe Store was just off-photo at left. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

A quarter century later, the pedestrian mall was removed and this section of Bank Square and Main Street reopened, July 6, 1994, to one-way vehicular traffic north. A half-century after Urban Renewal, Rent-A-Center and MC Cycle now occupy the space at left and several businesses are now located in the former Benjamin's, which had been home to Woolworth's from 1937-1970 and the Sundial Shop from 1973-2010. 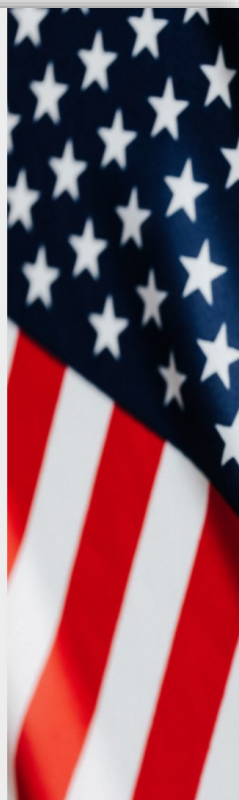

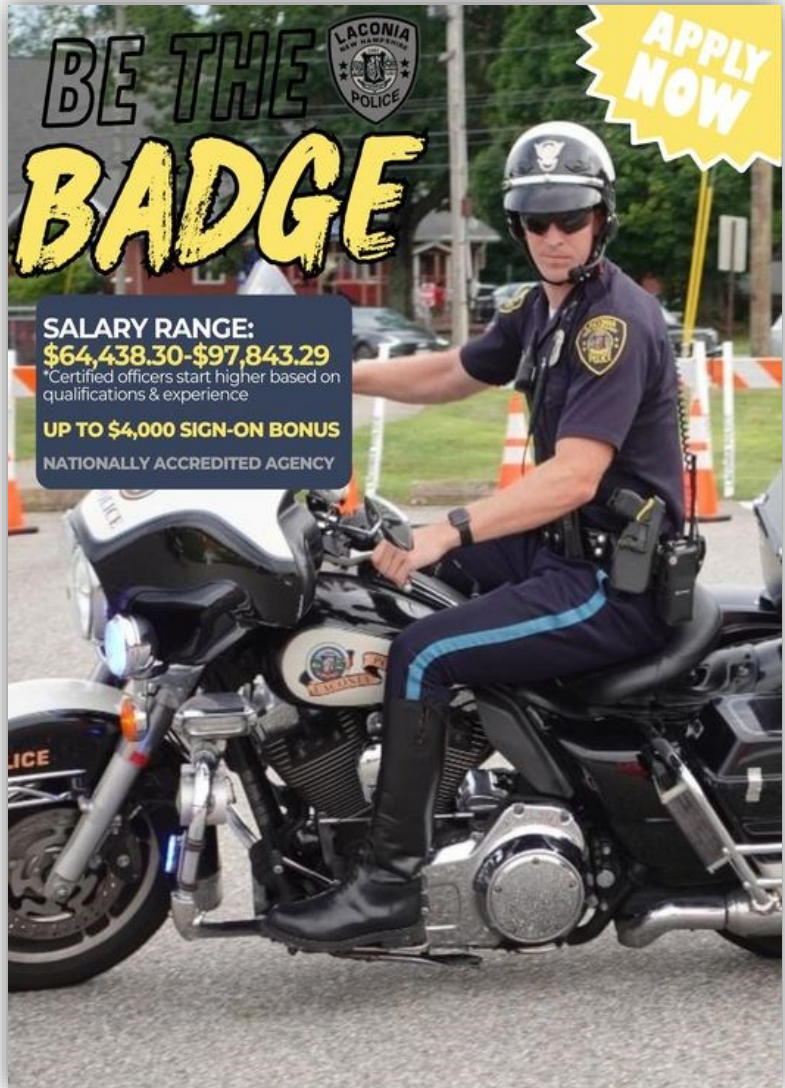
