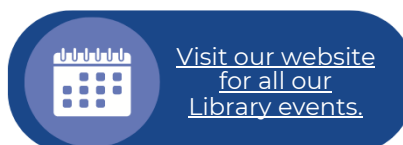

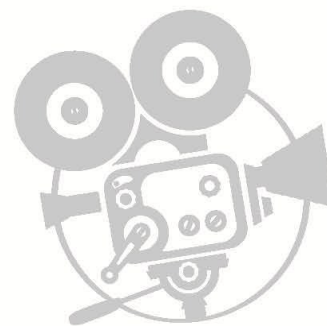

The New Hampshire Department of Safety's Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is receiving reports of a text message scam in which recipients are asked to submit personal information.

The DMV has received multiple reports of text messages, appearing to be sent from an official State of New Hampshire email address, that informs recipients that their "profile information is incomplete" and asks them to update "NH DMV contact details" by clicking on a link. The link opens to a submission form on what appears to be an official DMV website, with the actual DMV logo. It then asks recipients to submit their driver's license or state identification number and their name.

"The New Hampshire DMV never asks for personal information by text message," said DMV Director John Marasco. "We urge all residents to remain vigilant for scams and encourage anyone who feels unsure about a communication from the DMV to contact our Customer Service line directly at (603) 227-4000."

Anyone who receives a text message claiming to be from the New Hampshire DMV should not submit any personal information and report the message to the Consumer Protection Hotline at the Consumer Protection and Antitrust Bureau of the New Hampshire Attorney General's Office at 1(603) 271-3641 or [DOJ-CPB@doj.nh.gov](mailto:DOJ-CPB@doj.nh.gov).

Anyone who believes they are a victim of a scam or identity theft should also file a report with their local police department, review personal credit reports, and consider setting up fraud alerts or a credit freeze. Identity theft victims can also file a report with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) at [IdentityTheft.gov](https://www.ftc.gov) or call 1(877) 438-4338.

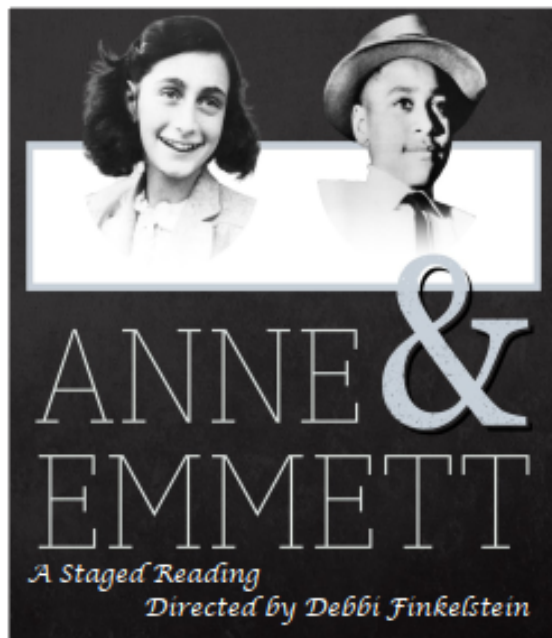
## CASTING CALL FOR "ANNE & EMMETT"

Anne & Emmett will be presented as a staged reading. It is an imaginary conversation between Anne Frank and Emmett Till, both victims of racial intolerance and hatred. Frank is the 13-year-old Jewish girl whose Diary provided a gripping perspective of the Holocaust. Till is the 14-year old African-American boy whose brutal murder in Mississippi sparked the Modern American Civil Rights Movement. The two teenagers meet in a town called Memory, a place that isolates them from the cruelty they experienced during their lives.

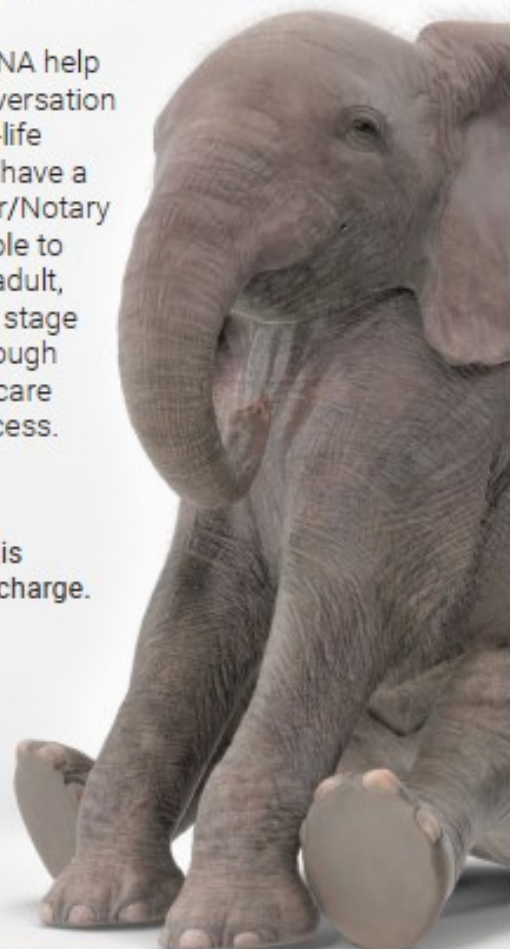

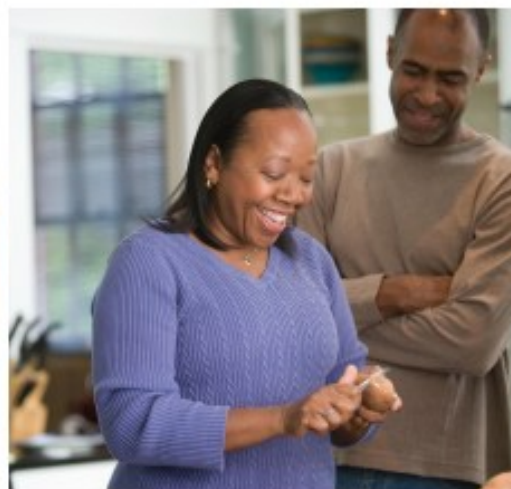

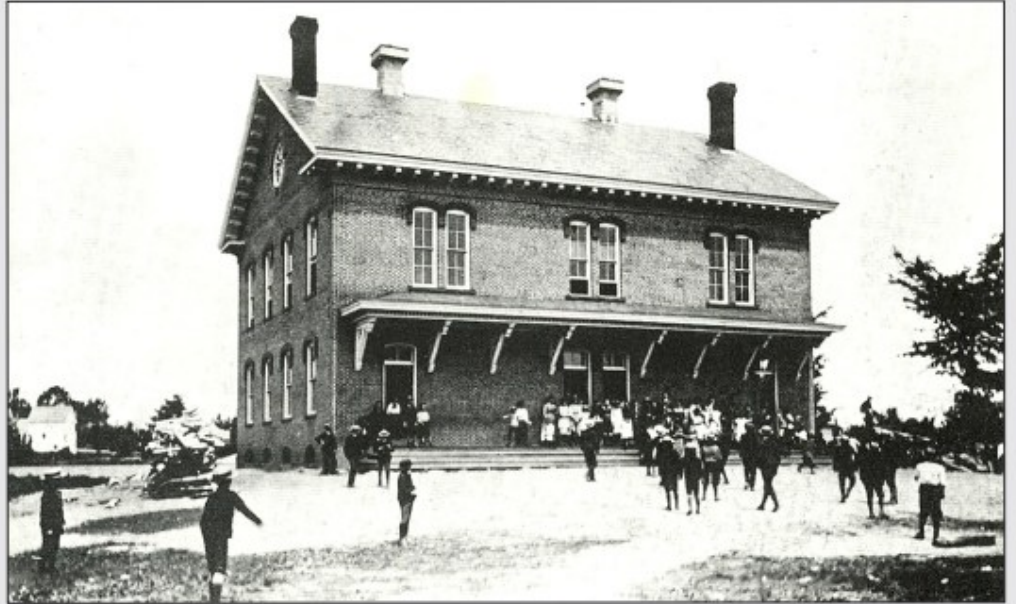


# Our Yesterdays

## THEN...

The School Street (later renamed Harvard Street) School, Laconia, completed in early May 1869, is seen in the 1870s. Middle Street (later renamed Dartmouth Street) begins off-photo at far right, with its northern reaches glimpsed in distance at left. The brick school building was gutted by fire, Feb. 17, 1900 — 125 years ago this week. See this week's 'Our Yesterdays.' (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



## ... AND NOW

A two-room addition to the building was put on in 1928, as seen from Dartmouth (formerly Middle) Street, at right. The former elementary school became the School Administration Building and office of the superintendent in August 1961. The first two houses in distance, at right, were the original School Street School, cut in half and relocated when the 1869 brick structure was built. (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)
