


Bolduc Park is a great course for advanced golfers wishing to work on their short game and it is an ideal course for beginning golfers.

Do you have a child aged 8 to 13 who'd like to try out golf? Golf is a great option for kids who may prefer an individual sport in a non-competitive setting.

Now is the time for Adults and Youth to sign up for Bolduc Park's three week golf lesson sessions. Adult lessons will be held Tuesdays at 5:30pm. Session 1 runs May 6, 13, 20. A second session for beginners runs June 3, 10, 17. Youth lessons will be held at 5:30pm on Thursdays. Session 1 is May 8, 15, 22. Session 2 is June 5, 12, 19.

May is Historic Preservation Month. What structures do you find valuable for their historic, cultural, aesthetic, or their community significance?

The City of Laconia Heritage Commission would like to recognize anyone who owns an historic property in Laconia and has, or is in the process of, preserving the structure's history. The project maintains historic details. In this endeavor, the Heritage Commission would like anyone who knows of a person, a business or an organization

who has made significant efforts to preserve historic buildings to nominate an individual, business, organization or a project for a preservation award to be presented at a City Council meeting at the end of May. The building must be more than 50 years old and add aesthetic value to its locality.

You may pick up a nomination form from the Code Enforcement Office at Laconia City Hall or from the Heritage Commission webpage <https://www.laconianh.gov/410/Heritage-Commission>. To assist the Heritage Commission members in recognizing and thanking those who have contributed to the historic preservation of a building, please describe the renovations, some history and its cultural significance, and include, if possible, before and after photos.

Nomination forms must be submitted by April 30, 2025.

What is the purpose of a Heritage Commission? In Laconia, the Heritage Commission was established to ensure the proper recognition, use and protection of resources, primarily man-made, that are valuable for their historic, cultural, aesthetic, or community significance within their natural built or cultural context in accordance with RSA 684:44-a. In the past the Heritage Commission has been involved in the attempts to preserve the Hathaway House, St. Joseph Church, the Belknap Mill, and employed Mae Williams, Architectural Historian & Preservation Consultant, to do a study of historical resources of Laconia's Downtown district which was published May 4, 2021. Please consider becoming a member of Laconia's Heritage Commission.

Dear Neighbors and Friends,

The Laconia- Gilford Lions Club and UUSL (Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia) Green Sanctuary volunteers will be out in front of the church at 172 Pleasant Street on Saturday, April 26th from 11am until 1pm.

We are collecting # 6 Styrofoam, soft plastics, and single-serve sized pop-top canned food for our Community Action Program (CAP). Additionally there is need for travel-sized hygiene products, towelettes (Wet Ones), hand sanitizers, personal care products (Depends for men and women).

Soft plastics and Styrofoam must be clean and free of labels. Plastics cannot be any snack bags, candy wrappers, any product wrapping that is "crunchy" sounding. Mailers are acceptable. No bird seed or pet food bags can be collected.
