FIRE DANGER: LITHIUM BATTERIES

tunnel in the commercial customer building. Fire Department personnel responded and stopped the fire from spreading. The load had to be dumped on the floor as it continued to smolder. After it was extinguished, the source was determined to be a vape device that was between two mattresses.

The Governor signed a law that effective July 1, 2025, stating that rechargeable lithium-ion batteries will be prohibited from disposal in New Hampshire's landfills and incinerators. Lithium-ion batteries are used in a wide variety of consumer products, including: Automotive vehicles; electric bikes and scooters; lawncare equipment; portable electronics such as cell phones, laptops, tablets, cameras, wireless headphones, speakers, toothbrushes and other rechargeable devices; cordless power tools; toys and vape devices.

You do not have to wait for July 1st to recycle batteries. Any battery that is rechargeable, is recyclable.

Many New Hampshire businesses, like Staples, Best Buy or BatteriesPlus, offer collection boxes for recycling rechargeable batteries. To find a drop-off site nearest to you, contact Public Works at 603-528-6379, check the Call2Recycle.org, website or check the website of one of the retail locations mentioned above. Laconia Public Works also collects rechargeable batteries during its annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day. The collection is limited to Laconia residents only.



In 1855, Laconia was incorporated as a town from lands at Meredith Bridge, Lakeport, Weirs and from a part of Gilmanton. At the first legal town meeting, the town voted James S Hoit, Hugh Blaisdell, Augustus Doe, Horatio N Burnham and John C. Davis as constables. These constables were citizens elected by the community to enforce laws and serve warrants, but little else is known about them.






REMOVE THE TICK PROMPTLY AND PROPERLY:

Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to your skin's surface as possible.



CLEAN THE BITE AREA:

After removing the tick, thoroughly clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol, an iodine scrub, or soap and water.



DISPOSE OF THE TICK SAFELY:

Save the tick in a sealed bag with a damp cotton ball or blade of grass, along with the date and location of the bite, to show your doctor if you develop symptoms later.

MONITOR FOR SYMPTOMS:

It's crucial to watch for symptoms of Lyme disease for up to 30 days. The risk of Lyme disease transmission is generally low if a tick has been attached for less than 24-36 hours.


**Belknap Mill to Unveil
New Exhibit:
“Threads of
Innovation” Opening
Friday, June 6**

The Belknap Mill, the oldest unaltered brick textile mill in the United States, is proud to announce the opening of its newest permanent exhibit, “Threads of Innovation,” debuting to the public on Friday, June 6, 2025.

This thoughtfully curated exhibit explores the Belknap Mill’s pivotal role as a leader in early industrial efficiency and innovation.

At its center is the c.1890s freight elevator, a key technological advancement that allowed seamless movement of materials between floors.

This innovation supported a vertically integrated production process, allowing raw cotton to be transformed into finished cloth entirely under one roof.



“Threads of Innovation” offers a hands-on and immersive experience that highlights the Mill’s groundbreaking approach to organization and manufacturing — a model that helped shape the structure of modern industry.

“The Belknap Mill is not only a symbol of Laconia’s industrial heritage but also of the ingenuity and adaptation that defined early American manufacturing,” said Dr. Katherine Switala-Elmhurst, Vice Chair of the Board at the Belknap Mill. “This new exhibit brings that legacy to life in a powerful and accessible way.”

To mark the exhibit’s opening and celebrate summer, the Belknap Mill will also host a free outdoor concert as part of its First Friday festivities. Enjoy the swinging sounds of the Freese Brothers Big Band performing live jazz and swing in Rotary Riverside Park at 6:00 PM. Bring a blanket or lawn chair and relax by the Winnipesaukee River for a fun and festive evening!

Thread of Innovation will be available to all visitors during regular museum hours: Wednesday–Thursday from 12–4 PM and Friday- Saturdays from 10–4 PM. Admission is \$10 for adults, \$5 for seniors and students, and free for children under 12 and Mill members.

Visitors are also encouraged to explore the Mill’s featured art exhibition in the Riverside Art Gallery: “Unscripted” by Grace Howe, throughout June.





Union Avenue at Baldwin Street (right) is seen during Laconia's Urban Renewal Program, in late March 1971, when the Garneau — formerly Belisle — Apartments (left) were being demolished and the Baldwin Cape (center) would be next, along with Hayward's Country Store (off-photo at left). Grove Street at that time, ran from Avery Street to Union Avenue, just to the left of the Garneau Apartments. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)
