


This year marks the 102nd anniversary of Laconia Motorcycle Week, the world's oldest motorcycle rally!

Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction Hosts Christmas in July 2025 on The Mount Washington

All proceeds to benefit the Auction

For the third year, the Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction will host a Christmas in July event on the MS Mount Washington on Thursday, July 10, from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. to raise funds for local children and families in need.

Tickets cost \$66 and include a performance by the PowerChords on the boardwalk, a three-hour cruise, buffet dinner, dancing and a selection of songs from the Powerhouse Collaborative Theatre's upcoming August performance of "Elf," the musical. The event offers a cash bar and a complimentary wine tasting by Hermit Woods Winery, live broadcasting from the Mount by Lakes 101.5 FM and 104.9 FM The Hawk. Santa and the Grinch will also be aboard the sunset cruise, and a silent auction and 50/50 raffle will be held.

For the second year in a row, for every ticket purchased before June 28, a free ticket will be given to the Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction so it can host a free daytime cruise on Aug. 6 for children who would not otherwise be able to get out on the water. For an additional \$10 per car, passengers can secure a pre-purchased parking spot, and for another \$10, select a seat on the Mount and board early.

Enforcement Penalties Begin on June 10.

According to our records, your traffic violation remains unpaid. Under New Hampshire Code 15C-16.003, if your fine is not settled by June 9, 2025, the following penalties will be enforced:

1. DMV violation database reporting
2. Suspension of vehicle registration effective June 10
3. 30-day suspension of driving license
4. Toll service referral with additional 35% processing charge
5. Possible legal prosecution and credit rating damage

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past...

THEN...

South Main Street, Laconia, is seen in 1962, just before the majestic elm was taken down. From left, the Stafford Homestead (including Grace Stafford's Bakery) at 406, the Dr. Lester R. Brown House (by that time occupied by W.D. Huse & Co. Inc. (paints and hardware) at 420, the former Cantin Chevrolet Building (Joe Taillefer's Barber Shop) at 426 and the Harriman Block (Gaudet's Market, formerly Page & Wheeler) at the corner of Court Street. In the distance, Laflamme's Bakery and the Oscar A. Lougee Department Store Building (Tilton Block) are glimpsed. In the next 10 years, Urban Renewal would take all but the Stafford Homestead — itself demolished by the late 1970s to make way for an Indian Head Bank branch (later Northway and Camden Banks) Off-photo at left, an apartment building and the tire business of Simon Lacey had been South Main Street landmarks for decades.
