

# Book Page Wreath Instructions:

## Materials Needed:

Cardboard

Book (You don't mind ripping pages out of)

Stapler & Staples

Scissors

Glue Gun

- 1) Cut out a circle from your piece of cardboard any size you wish. For a solid wreath (that looks more like a flower), you will just use a solid cardboard circle. If you wish to have a more traditional wreath shape, you will need to cut a smaller circle out of the center to create a cardboard ring.
- 2) Remove pages from book
- 3) Once you have 50 or so pages ripped out, you can start rolling and stapling. Take one page and roll so one corner creates a point (see right).
- 4) Fold over bottom end and staple.



- 5) Try and make several cones about the same length for the outer two rows. I glued four cones onto the cardboard circle to start – placing them on the edge in a compass configuration – North, East, South and West – so that I could then try and evenly space the remaining cones. Complete outer edge.



- 6) In the next row, stagger the cones so that they are between the cones of the first row.



- 7) By the third row, it was getting crowded so the placement of cones went to “skip two, then glue”.



- 8) At this point, I started tearing the pages in half to make smaller cones to fill in the center. Continue filling in center and reducing size of cone until complete.
- 9) To finish, you can hot glue a piece of ribbon to the back of the wreath any length you desire.
