

Melted Crayon Art

MATERIALS

- Canvas
- 12 Crayons cut in half (24 half pieces)–
any color selections
- Black paper or cut out silhouette
- Recycled jar

TOOLS (TO SHARE)

- Hair dryer
- Glue gun
- X-acto Knife
- Scissors

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut chosen crayons in half
2. Arrange crayons across top of canvas, or in any pattern along an edge
3. Hot glue crayons to canvas in your pattern
4. Let glue cool enough that the crayons are firmly attached
5. Cut out silhouette (can be done before or after melting, depending on how long the wait is at the melting station)

AT MELTING STATION

1. Hold jar firmly over spot you want to put silhouette
2. Prop up canvas for gravity to help wax melt
3. Melt crayons slowly, moving hair dryer evenly over crayons (don't over melt, or it will blend and cover the whole canvas). It will take a bit of time to start, but then will melt quickly once it does)
4. Glue silhouette to empty space on canvas, where the jar was
5. Let cool before moving too much, as the crayons may continue to melt, and melt off the glue (if they do, you can re-attach)
